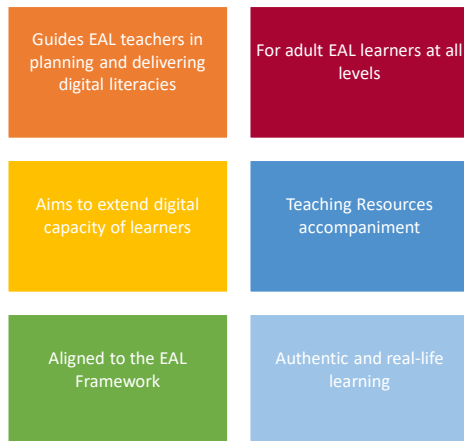

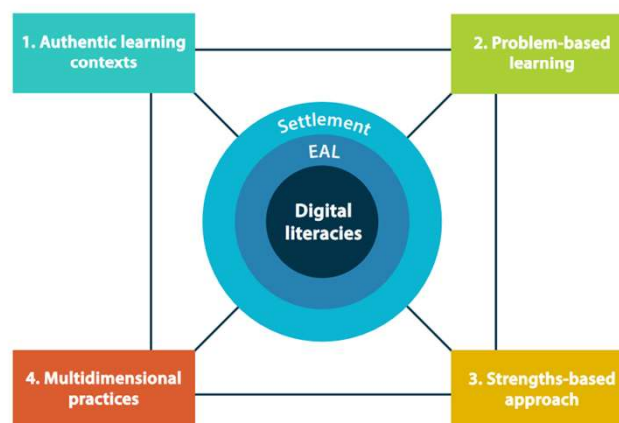


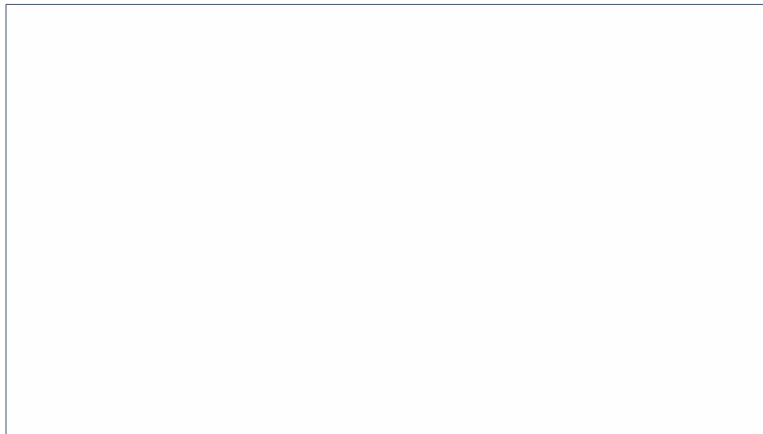
Figure 1. The AMEP Digital Literacies Framework

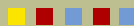
